BIN WORK GUIDELINES

- 1. Bin Work is defined as 2D works that are placed in the Bin Racks.
- 2. A "Bin Work" Inventory sheet must be completed for all bin Work.
- 3. Pieces that were not accepted into a juried show may not be entered as Bin Work during that show.
- 4. Bin Work may not be displayed that has been displayed as Bin Work less than three months before it is brought in. *Exceptions to this are "Art for \$100 or Less", "Outdoor Art Market", "Holiday Art & Gift Market" and "Two Night Stands"
- 5. A maximum of 10 pieces per artist may be displayed in Bin Racks at any one time. A sold piece may be replaced.
- 6. Bin Work may only be brought in the day of Intake for a show. It is subject to the entry fee for the show, if any.
- 7. Bin Work may stay in Bin Rack for 3 months. However, there are shows which require all Bin Work to be removed. Bin Work can only be brought back in on the day of the next Intake for a show. It is subject to the entry fee for the show, if any.
- 8. If one or more shows during the 3 months your Bin Work is in the bin rack requires an entry fee, each of those show fees must be paid. Example: Put work in Bin on Jan 1^{st} juried show \$10.00

Feb 1^{st} – non juried show – no fee due Mar 1^{st} – juried show - \$10.00 Total paid for Bin Work placed in bin rack Jan 1^{st} . - \$20.00

- 9. Each piece must be labeled on the BACK with Artist's name, contact info., title and price.
- 10. Giclée and Reproductions are allowed in the Bin Work. Each piece <u>must</u> be clearly labeled on the <u>BACK</u> that it is a Reproduction or Giclée of an original piece of art.
- 11. Bin Work must be completely covered and secured in acetate sleeves.
- 12. Bin Work must be clean and presentable. Please no yellowed mats, bent corners, torn acetate, etc.
 *Bin Master will remove work that is not presentable.
- 13. Bin Work must be flat. Our Bin Racks cannot accommodate works on stretched canvas or in frames.
